### MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

It's fall in Boise, and the leaves are changing, the weather is changing, and the length of the day is changing. This reminds me that change and growth never stop in schools. At St. Joseph's Catholic School, we are guided by our mission and the goals set out in our accreditation plan, and we continue to change and refine what we do to ensure that our graduates are ready to excel in high school and exceed competitive standards to get into colleges with scholarships in hand.

The three goals in our accreditation plan are:

**Goal #1: Provide additional learning support for students with special learning needs (high/low)**

To help address Goal #1, we continue to develop the role of our full-time counselor, who is working to help with student accommodation plans. We have expanded the coverage of our school nurse to best care for students with injury and illness, including academic needs when applicable. Faculty has weekly time set aside for collaboration, and we reviewed our fall MAP scores to help us identify which students need extra interventions.

**Goal #2: Prepare our students and staff for their immediate and long-term future academically and spiritually through the efficient and responsible use of technology**

For Goal #2, we are working our way through a 5-year technology replacement plan. This year, we added 90 more Chromebooks, two carts for holding and charging devices, and are piloting a Clevertouch as a possible replacement to Smartboards and pro-

jectors. Our teachers incorporate aspects of digital citizenship into their classes as they continue to use Google's G-Suite for Education in their classes.

**Goal #3: Improve student learning in the area of writing and grammar instruction**

For Goal #3, students are continuing to write more, and teachers are integrating more grammar instruction into the context of reading and writing. It is important that students are able to articulate their thoughts well in writing.

Even with all this growth and change, St. Joseph's Catholic School remains true to our tradition of excellence, educating area students for over 117 years. In 2017, we have:

- **394 students currently enrolled**
- **2 classes per grade level**
- **140 students in the middle school—35.5% of the overall student population**
- **42 teachers and staff**

For the 2017-18 school year, St. Joseph's Catholic School finds itself in what is becoming a familiar and challenging, but positive situation: the school is still near capacity. Three years ago, our School Board set the capacity of St. Joseph's Catholic School at 400 students because we determined that keeping the number at 400 would best serve our students. If we were to place the maximum number of students in each class, our school would have around 452 students. However, this would make seating at concerts, access to restrooms, parent-teacher conferences,



etc. a challenge. St. Joseph's Catholic School wants to maintain a high level of education for all students.

St. Joseph's Catholic School is working to change and grow, but we want to continue to fulfill our mission: *St. Joseph's Catholic School seeks to provide all children with an opportunity to develop spiritually, academically, morally, emotionally, and physically, in an environment of Christ-centered attitudes and values. Staff and parents are committed to preparing students to take their place in their own community and the world at-large by fostering a love for lifelong learning and a responsibility to others.*

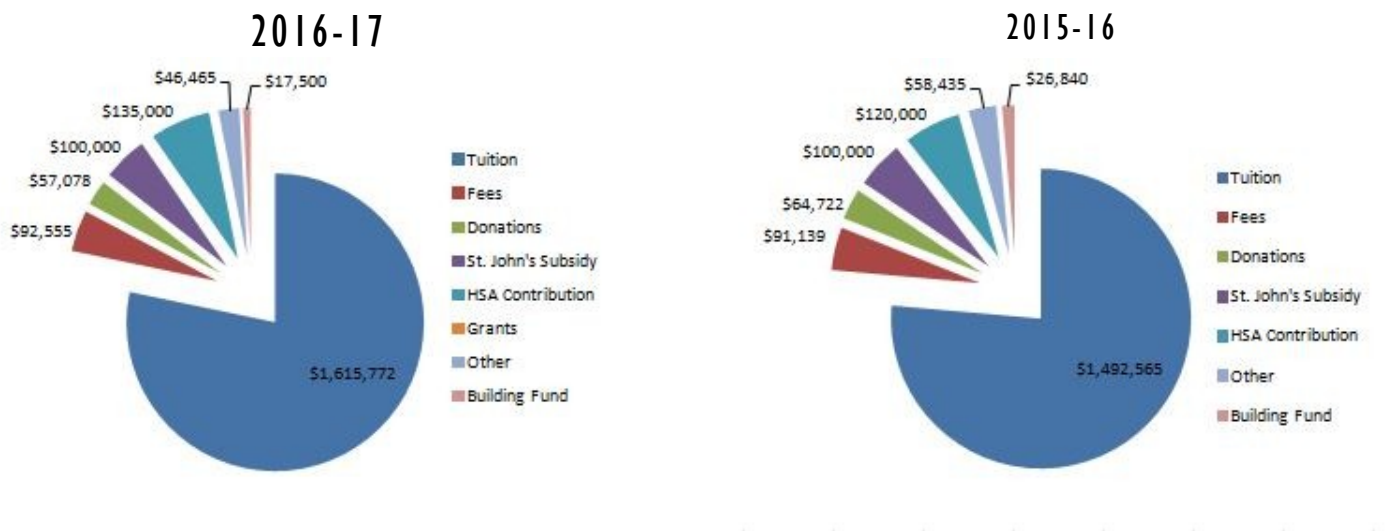
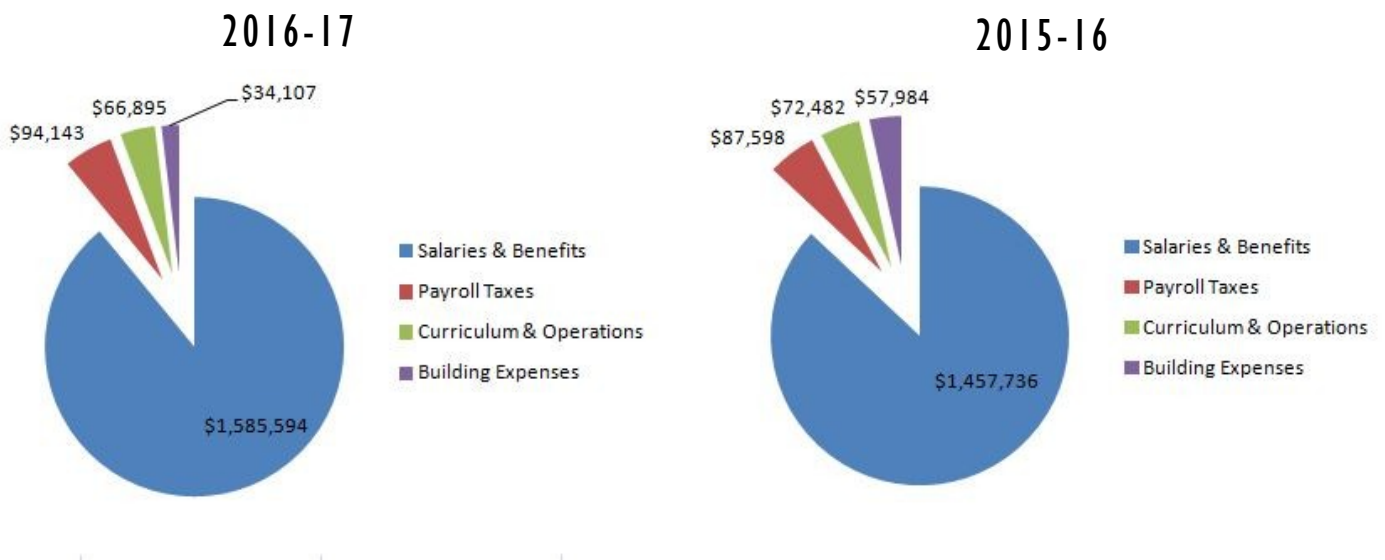

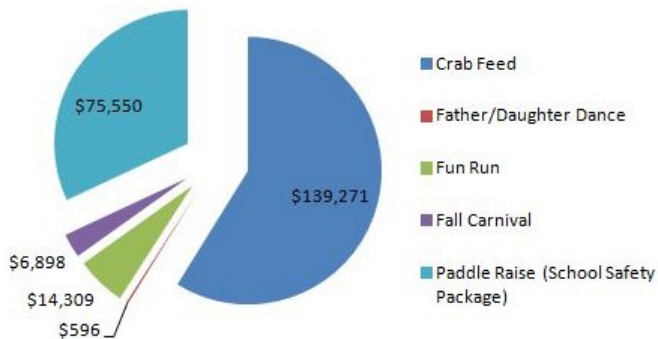

# ANNUAL REPORT

*During the 2016-17 school year, St. Joe's celebrated the canonization of Mother Teresa and dedicated our year to her. On May 26, St. Joe's closed out the school year with a balloon rosary led by the student council. Several students were also recognized for modeling Mother Teresa—making our community a more Christian and loving place with their kind behavior.*

*After the rosary, students were treated to fun displays of talent by their classmates. Each class then shared highlights from their year—many through an original song—and were welcomed to the next grade. It was a fantastic celebration of another great year at St. Joe's!*



## SCHOOL HISTORY

**1900:** St. Joseph's School was founded by the Sisters of the Holy Cross.

**1925:** St. Joseph's distinct red brick school building at the corner of 9th and Fort Streets was completed. The new building had eight classrooms and cost \$38,000.

**1948:** The current gymnasium was constructed at a cost of \$89,000. The new building seated 400 people on permanent bleachers.

**1953:** St. Joseph's transitioned from an all-boys school to a grammar school for both boys and girls. St. Teresa's Academy transitioned from an all-girls school to a high school for both boys and girls.

**1991:** Began a multi-phase, 20-year expansion and renovation, with the addition of the Media Center, office and addi-

tional classroom space to the school building.

**1997:** A new heating and air conditioning system and energy efficient windows were installed to increase efficiency and comfort, and to improve the learning environment.

**1999:** The school office and library were remodeled. The changes to the office increased school security and productivity.

**2002:** Expanded the Media Center and provided five new classrooms, including a Science Lab and Art Room.

**2011:** *E.L. Wiegand Wing* completed, adding five new classrooms and finalizing the multi-phase, 20-year expansion and renovation project.

**2013:** Received a \$50,000 grant from the J.A. and Kath-

ryn Albertson Foundation, to become part of the nation's first statewide pilot of the Khan Academy—a free, internationally recognized online leader. The grant was used for training and technology upgrades to the school.

**2014:** Received an additional \$70,000 grant from the J. A. and Kathryn Albertson Foundation to provide over 100 Google Chromebooks for the 3rd and 4th grade classrooms.

**2015:** Revamped web site—[www.stjoes.com](http://www.stjoes.com). The mobile-friendly design improves functionality, while continuing to provide information to current and prospective students and families.

**2016:** Earned a 6-year accreditation status from the Western Catholic Education Association. Added office for new full-time counselor and remodeled

office space for reading specialists.

**2017:** Updated school security systems—additional security cameras, a keypad at the front door, and a new external door to 8th St. were all installed. Ongoing facility needs will continue to be monitored and upgraded as needed.
