Students Trek to McCall for Ultimate Field Trip

t. Joe's 6th grade class recently experienced a one-of-a-kind learning experience at the University of Idaho's McCall Outdoor Science School (MOSS) – Idaho's only publicly operated K-12 outdoor school.

The kids studied and explored Ponderosa State Park and Payette Lake, blogging about their adventures each day. Their field instructors were University of Idaho graduate students who taught them about the geology of McCall along with an understanding of how all ecosystems are important. They learned a 'tree-mendous' amount about the various trees in the park along with the different ecosystems found there. Night-time activities included an egg drop (simulating the 'beaver-drop'

done by the forest service in the 1940s) and a talk from a smoke jumper. Festivities cultimated in a bonfire on the last night!

On Friday, teams presented results of their week-long science experiments through videos starring the kids themselves. Topics included: growing avocados in the park; using aspen dust as sunscreen; core tempera-

ture of trees versus air; comparing water quality for humans to drink; a perfect ecosystem for a frog home; and fire resistance of differing ages of Ponderosa Pines

Mrs. McClure and her students are still smiling from their adventures. They had a blast!

The Accreditation Team observed and assessed St. Joe's: Catholic Identity, Organization for Learning how the school is governed and administrated),

Curriculum and Instruction, Support Services (academic counseling, assisting students with special needs, spiritual counseling) and Resources (financial and human resources). St. Joe's greatly appreciates the prayers and support of the St. John's community, Fr. Jerry Funke, the St. Joe's School Board, our parents and our students. The Accreditation Visit was a great success: our WCEA Accreditation has been renewed for another six years!
